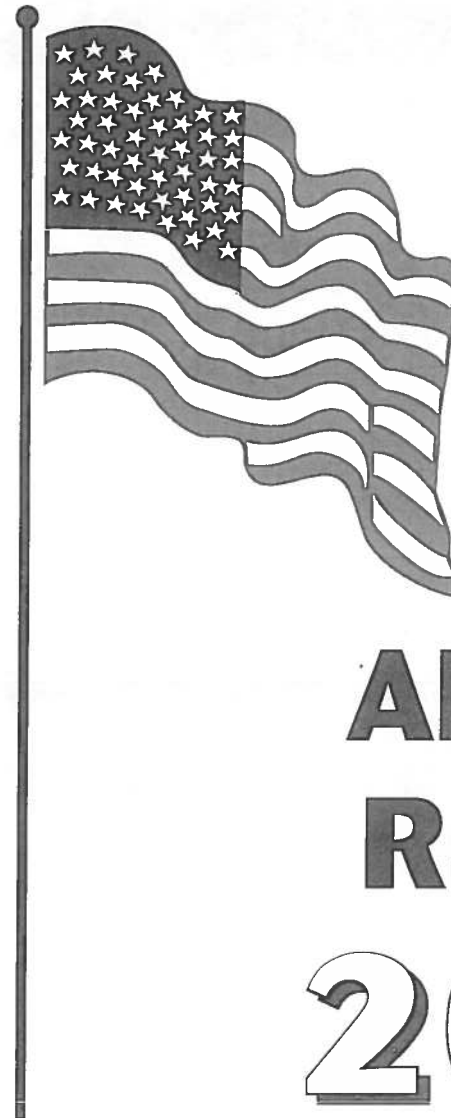

The Tuscarawas County Health Department, like other health departments statewide, experienced a significant shift in its focus and function as a result of 9-11-01. We face a challenge of unparalleled proportions in the coming weeks to months. Although we have been training for a bio-terrorist event since June of 1998, the true potential for these threats was made painfully apparent. In the days following 9-11, we answered multiple anthrax related events. Fortunately, none of these cases were found to be problematic. They served to test the response mechanism guidelines, enabling us to hone the guidelines and maximize our response while minimizing the disruption of other daily tasks. The task is far from complete. We are updating smallpox guidelines that are decades old. We are constantly surveying the local medical community to discover trends in illnesses and identify potential "mini-epidemics" early. We have started sending out a bi-monthly newsletter on public health related issues to medical providers. Additionally, we are working more closely with other county agencies, such as EMA, to provide service and support where needed. Another new focus is in the area of chronic disease management. We are developing resources and programs to help local residents with diabetes, high cholesterol, heart disease and hypertension cope with their illness through Therapeutic Lifestyle Changes (TLC). The Environmental Health division is working hard to accommodate changes in recent legislation regarding private sanitary sewer and food service inspections. They also continue to maintain active surveillance for new pathogens such as the Western Nile virus, monitor and spray the mosquito populations and evaluate for rabies. We thank Tuscarawas County and its residents for their continued support of the local health department and will work together to help ensure the healthiest future possible for all concerned.
