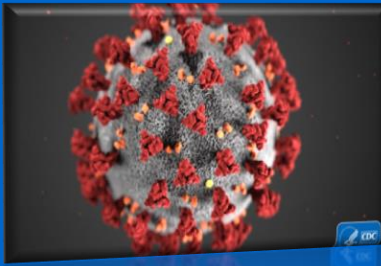

### Globally

**95,333 confirmed cases of COVID-19**

### China

**80,565 confirmed cases of COVID-19; 3,015 deaths (3.7%)**

### Outside of China

**14,768 confirmed cases in 85 countries of COVID-19; 267 deaths (1.8%)**

### United States

**229 confirmed cases of COVID-19; 12 deaths (5.1%)** (Washington: 70; Wisconsin, 1; Oregon: 3; California: 49; Nevada: 1; Arizona: 2; Colorado: 2; Texas: 5; Wisconsin: 1; Illinois: 5; Tennessee: 1; Georgia: 2; Florida: 4; North Carolina: 1; Maryland: 3; New York: 22; New Jersey: 2; Rhode Island: 2; Pennsylvania: 2; Massachusetts: 3; New Hampshire: 2; Diamond Princess: 46)

### Ohio

**0 confirmed cases of COVID-19; 2 persons under investigation in Ohio; 8 negative persons under investigation; 252 individuals under public health supervision (self-monitoring)**

Please note: TCHD will not be sharing information about individuals under public health supervision or under voluntary quarantine for COVID-19 in our County. These individuals are not showing any symptoms and are not under investigation. As is our normal practice when we monitor situations of infectious disease in the community, information will be shared as is necessary to protect the public while balancing individual privacy. As with other diseases, we do not routinely share suspected case information until it is confirmed. The same will be done with COVID-19.

CDC recommends that older adults or those who have chronic medical conditions consider postponing travel to the following destinations:

- Japan (Level 2 Travel Health Notice)

Travelers should practice usual precautions at the following destination:

- Hong Kong (Level 1 Travel Health Notice)

**Domestic Travel: There are no current domestic travel restrictions, however the CDC recommends all non-essential domestic business travel should be suspended.**
