

TUSCARAWAS COUNTY GENERAL HEALTH DISTRICT

ANNUAL REPORT - 1967

The Health Department Staff at the end of 1967 consisted of: 7 Registered Nurses; 1 Home Health Aide; 4 Sanitarians and 5 Clerks. Dr. Charles C. Newell, M.D., Health Commissioner, resigned in July 1967. Also resigning were 1 Sanitarian and 3 Nurses. Only 1 nurse being replaced leaving our staff short of: A Health Commissioner; 2 Registered Nurses and 1 Sanitarian as of December 31, 1967.

Every resident in Tuscarawas County (66,000) is effected in some way, either directly or indirectly by the activities of the health department. Inspections of restaurants, public water supplies, schools, grocery stores; milk; meat; swimming pools, parks etc. are a few of the services provided to safeguard the health which effects the lives of all residents within Tuscarawas County. 30,072 persons in Tuscarawas County received direct personal services from the Health Department during 1967.
