

A wise man once said, "Constant change is here to stay." Nowhere has that been truer than at the Tuscarawas County Health Department. Troubled times have led to increasing requests for service and needs for different types of service.

One of the most exciting programs we have developed has been a prescription assistance program that assists needy individual without any other access to medication. This program has been so popular that there is currently a waiting list for services.

Smallpox planning and pre-event immunization of volunteers is nearing completion and regional response coordination continues.

All of this occurs in a setting where the demand for the "usual" services such as environmental health and clinic visits continued unabated.

We'd like to thank the community for their unswerving support of the health department and look forward to serving you in the future.

In addition to a rapidly expanding response mechanism for bio-terrorist and natural disaster events, the current economic situation has led to "disasters" of a smaller and more personal nature. Increasing numbers of physicians are turning away individuals with limited or no insurance coverage. Local doctors are scaling back their practices in the face of the current malpractice crisis. This leads to an increased demand for our services.
