

The Tuscarawas County Health Department was privileged to continue serving the residents of our county in the year 2003. Those same individuals responded to our service by approving our operating levy for another ten years. We are extremely grateful to our county residents for their display of trust and confidence in these troubled times.

As we continue to expand our services to meet the needs we've identified in the county, tobacco cessation has been identified as an important modifiable risk factor. Working as a team with several other agencies in our county and in our region, we are actively trying to reduce smoking rates, particularly in women who are pregnant or considering pregnancy.

Women's Health Day, an event held in October and April, continues to be a popular and cost effective way for the Health Department to offer low cost laboratory services, female exams and mammograms. We also continue to participate in the Trinity Program that helps provide female exams and mammograms to eligible women free of charge.

Our Child Safety Coordinator/Health Educator, Debbie Crank, RN, has been recognized on a State level for excellence of service and dedication. She continues to provide numerous community educational events in other areas as well.

Our disaster planning continues. The plan has evolved into a system consistent with a process known as the incident command system which is utilized by other first responders such as police, fire, and EMA.
