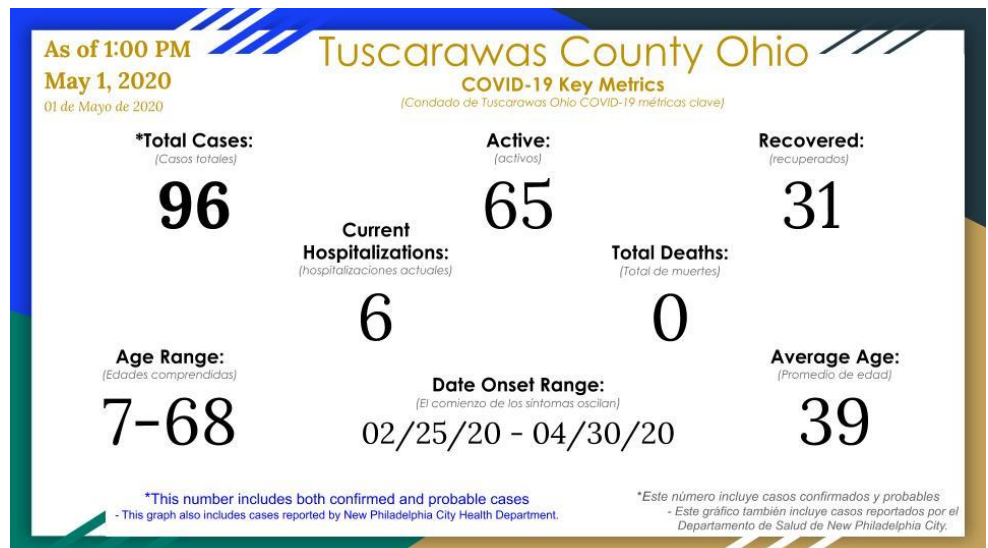

## SECTOR SPECIFIC OPERATING REQUIREMENTS

### Manufacturing, Distribution, and Construction:

- Ensure minimum 6 ft between people, if not possible, install barriers
- Face coverings are required for employees and distributors, unless not advisable by a healthcare professional, against documented industry best practices, or not permitted by federal or state laws/ regulations
- Employees must perform daily symptom assessment including taking temperature with thermometer
- Require employees to stay home if symptomatic
- Require regular handwashing
- Stagger or limit arrivals of employees and guests
- Personnel should work from home if possible

### Consumer, Retail & Services

**ALL** items listed above plus

- Place hand sanitizers in high-contact locations
- Clean high-touch items after each use (carts, baskets)
- Specify hours for at-risk populations

### General Office Environments

**ALL** items listed above plus

- Reduce sharing of work materials
- Limit travel as much as possible
- Post signage on health safety guidelines in common areas

### BUSINESSES MUST FOLLOW THESE ACTIONS WHEN A COVID-19 INFECTION IS IDENTIFIED:

- ✓ Immediately report employee or customer infections to the local health department
- ✓ Work with local health department to identify those potentially exposed to help facilitate contact tracing
- ✓ Shut down shop/floor for deep sanitation if possible
- ✓ Professionally clean and sanitize site/location
- ✓ Reopen in consultation with the local health department
