## Department Highlights

## Communicable Disease

- Top reported diseases in July 2023:
- COVID-19: 19 (-24)
- Chlamydia: $14(-3)$
- Lyme: 4 (+4)
- Total Confirmed Reported Diseases: 39 (+1)


## Prevention

- Distributed 144 Naloxone kits (+74)
- 16 known reversals (+9)
- 16 car seats distributed (+8)
- Safe sleep education completed with 11 families (+4)
- Traffic Safety YTD Statistics:
- Total YTD crashes investigated: 1,204 (-52 from 2022)
- Total YTD fatalities: 1 (-5 from 2022)
- Total crashes investigated in July 2023: 135 (-6)
- Most crashes occurred between 11:00-11:59am, 2:00-2:59pm, 3:00-3:59pm (8.1\%) and on Friday and Saturday (18\%)
- Top crash routes: SR-250 (15\%), IR-77 (13\%), and SR-39 (10\%)
- Top crash variables: Youth Related (36\%), Speed Related (26\%), Unbelted (21\%)

## Medical Clinic

- Charges $\$ 71,502$ ( 12 month average $\$ 64,502$ )
- Payments $\$ 33,860$ ( 12 month average $\$ 31,413$ )
- Largest Payer for July Medicaid (26\%)
- No shows 92 (19.5\% compared to 16.9\% last month)


## WIC

- 170 total contacts for breastfeeding support (-26)
- 76\% show rate in July (+2\%)
- 455 total appointments completed (-32)


## Promotion and Community Relations

- Trending Topics: COVID-19 home test availability and case count questions, mosquito control program, heat-related illnesses for humans and animals, sports physicals, back-to-school immunizations, and capacity for new patients at TCHD medical office.
- All Points Media campaigns were successfully launched with promotional banners/posters placed in businesses and organizations across Tuscarawas County to promote tobacco use cessation, Project DAWN, and childhood vaccinations.
