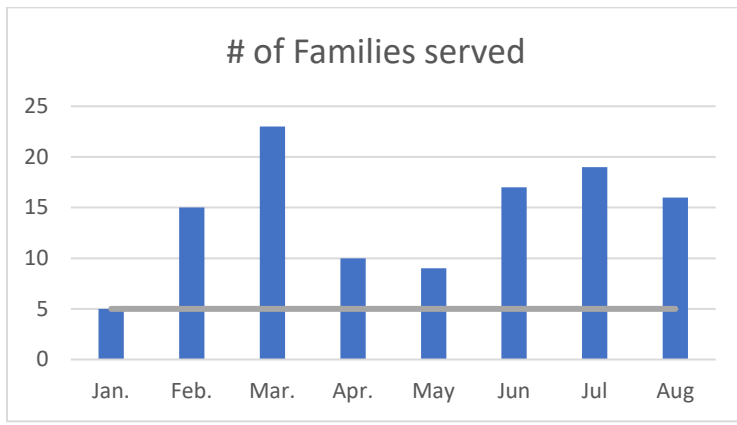

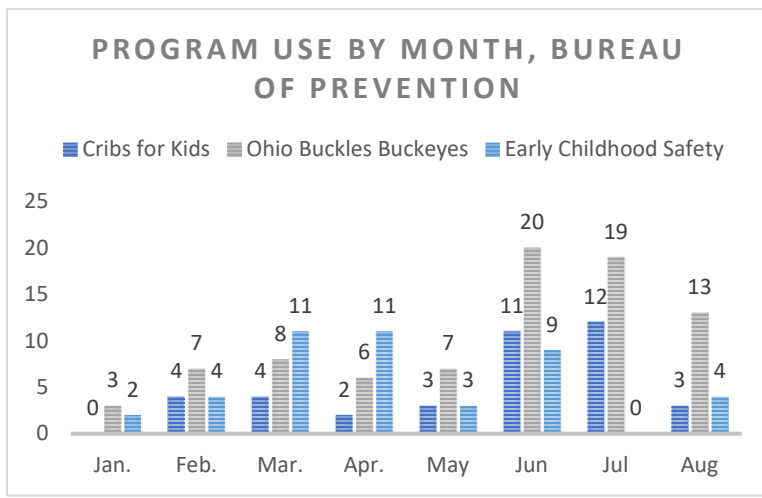

Emma Clark joined TCHD on August 22, 2022.

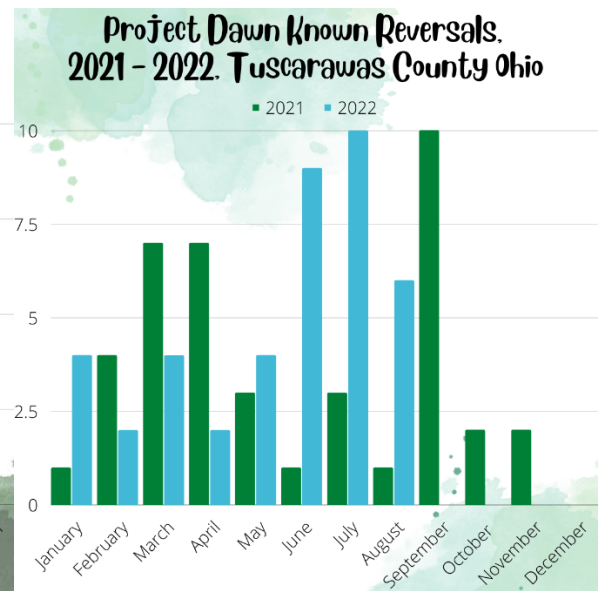
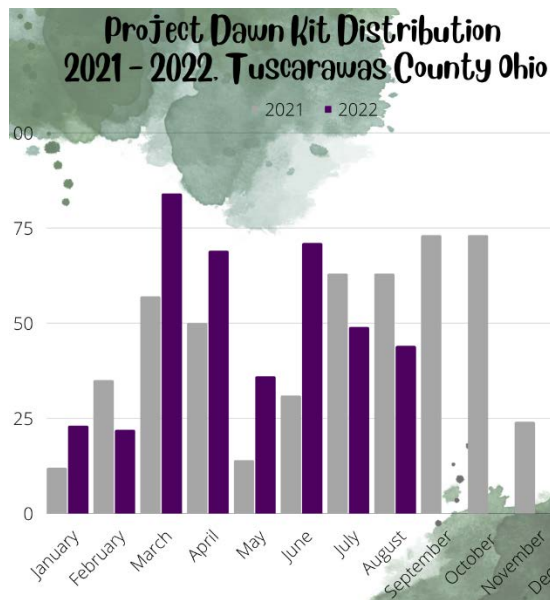
Received notice that TCHD was awarded \$4,000 for a mini-grant for Falls Prevention. The grant will start in October 2022.

Project Dawn:

During July 2022, TCHD distributed 44 Naloxone kits, trained 40 people, and 6 known reversals. That is a decrease of 10% of kits distributed July to August 2022.

Safe Beginnings:

Abigale and Abbie served four families during the month of August. There were three cribs and mattresses, two highchairs, three safety kits and four safety gates distributed in August.

Safe Communities:

Abbie attended the virtual Motorcycle Safety Committee meeting presented by the Ohio State Highway Patrol on August 17th. The meeting discussed upcoming construction zones, and motorcycle crashes and trends throughout District 7.

Abbie and Abigale represented TCHD and Safe Communities in Newcomers on August 13th during Second Saturday event. Messages of Click it or Ticket and Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over were promoted during the festival. Abbie and Abigale were able to interact with over twenty individuals at the festival, providing informational brochures and materials.

TCHD staff represented TCHD and Safe Communities in West Chester on August 20th at the Senior Center. The event included local law enforcement providing safety to the citizens of Tuscarawas County. During the event over one hundred and fifty (150) individuals were able to see the traffic safety messages of Click It Or Ticket, Drive Sober Or Get Pulled Over, Don't Text and Drive, and Look Out For Motorcycles.

Abbie, Emma, and Natasha represented TCHD and Safe Communities in Dover on August 24th at their Drive Sober Or Get Pulled Over kickoff event at Tuscarawas Valley Farmers Market. OhioSADD representative and Safe Communities partner, Deanne Hicks, was in attendance. Over the course of the event, over 100 attendees were able to see the traffic safety messages of Drive Sober Or Get Pulled Over and thirty (30) individuals were able to receive safety materials such as, informational brochures and traffic safety magnets.

Abbie and Abigale represented TCHD and Safe Communities in Dover on August 31st at the Tuscarawas Valley Farmers Market. Ohio State Highway Patrol trooper and Safe Communities partner, Jen Makris, was in attendance. Over the course of the event, over 60 attendees were able to see the traffic safety messages of Drive Sober Or Get Pulled Over and twenty (20) individuals were able to receive safety materials such as, informational brochures and traffic safety magnets.

Safe Communities staff distributed 792 campaign materials to the Tuscarawas County citizens at various events throughout the month of August.

Tobacco:

The Tobacco staff hosted the monthly Tobacco – Vaping Committee meeting where committee members began planning for the community cessation services scan, tobacco retailer compliance checks, youth

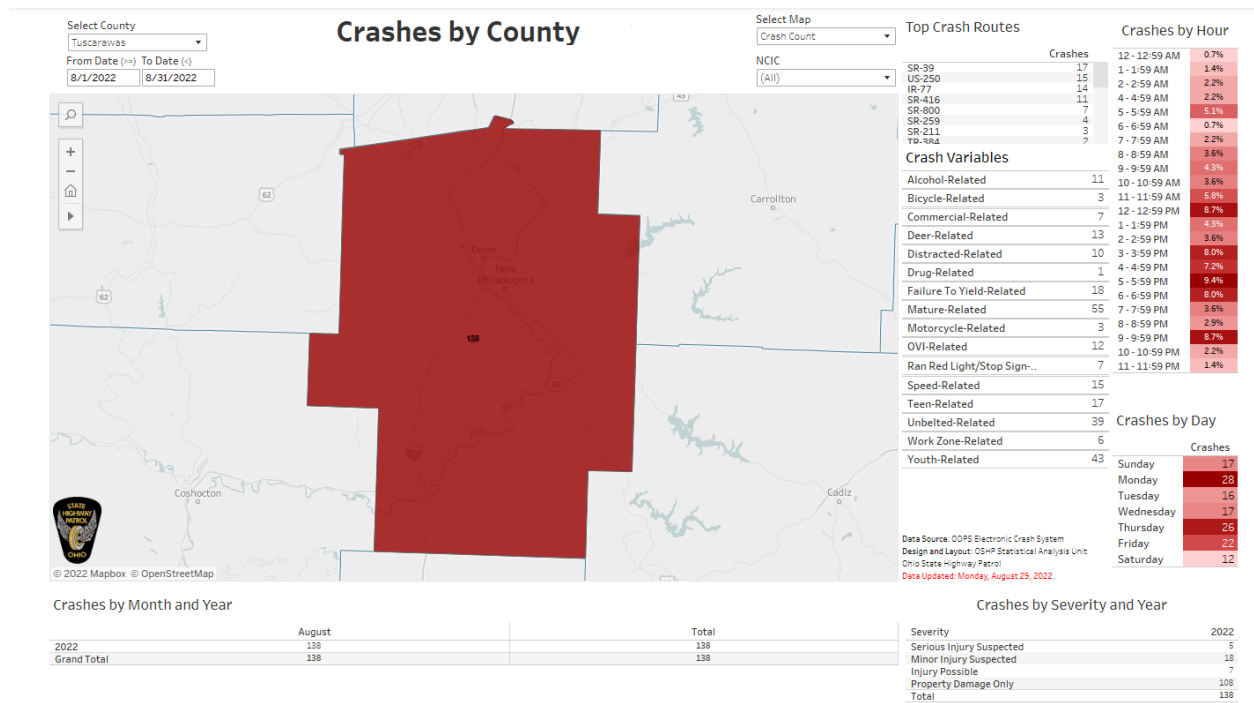
engagement project, and annual community survey on tobacco. All of these items are requirements of the tobacco grant for this grant year.

Katelyn met with Amy and Chelsea to plan an Ask, Advise, and Refer (AAR) and an Ask, Counsel, and Treat (ACT) cessation training with the clinic staff. She also held an AAR training with WIC the staff.

Tobacco cessation resources, STAND stretchy bands, and educational vaping information were distributed at the Tusky Valley, Strasburg, and Pro Via back to school events and the Mako's Market Drug Take Back and Resource Fair.

Traffic Safety:

The image below illustrates all crashes in August 2022 in Tuscarawas County. In August, there were a total of 138 accidents, none of which were fatal.
