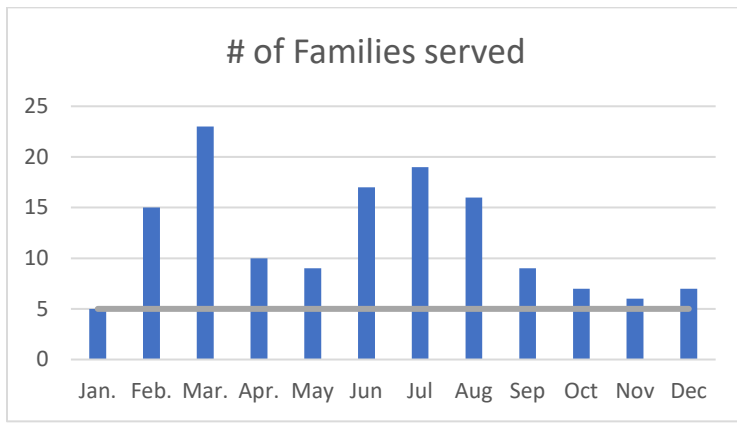

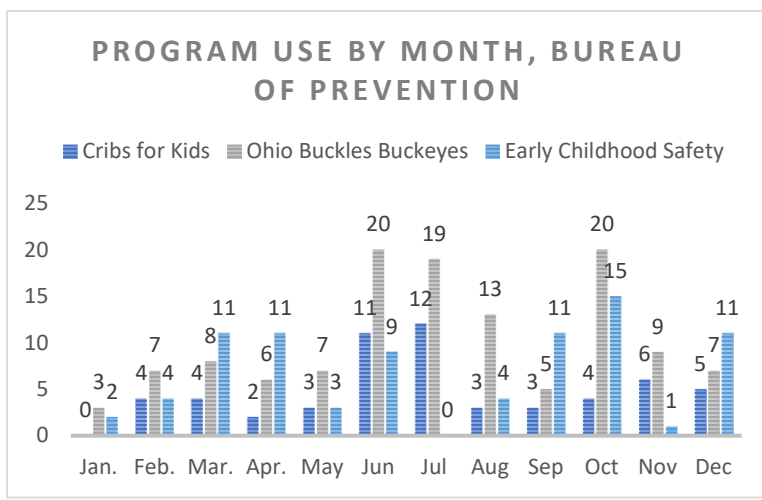

Abbie distributed seven (7) convertible car seats during the month of December.

Cribs for Kids:

Abbie completed safe sleep education with five (5) families and distributed five (5) cribettes to families with no other safe sleep options in the home.

Emergency Preparedness:

Natasha and Emma sat in on the Quarterly PHEP Epi Meeting on December 8th.

Natasha has been working with the NECO region and the Tuscarawas County EMA to plan the annual PHEP exercise. These years will be held on January 9 and will be a tabletop exercise on radiological. The save the date was sent on December 14 to stakeholders.

PHEP Deliverables 6.2 (Epi Meeting), 14.2 (Communications), and 16.1 (MCM inventory) were submitted to ODH for review and approval.

PHEP FY24 RFP was released on December 15 and is due on January 23, 2023.

Natasha was notified on December 5th that TCHD was not selected to receive funding for the Healthy Homes Lead Prevention Awareness Month.

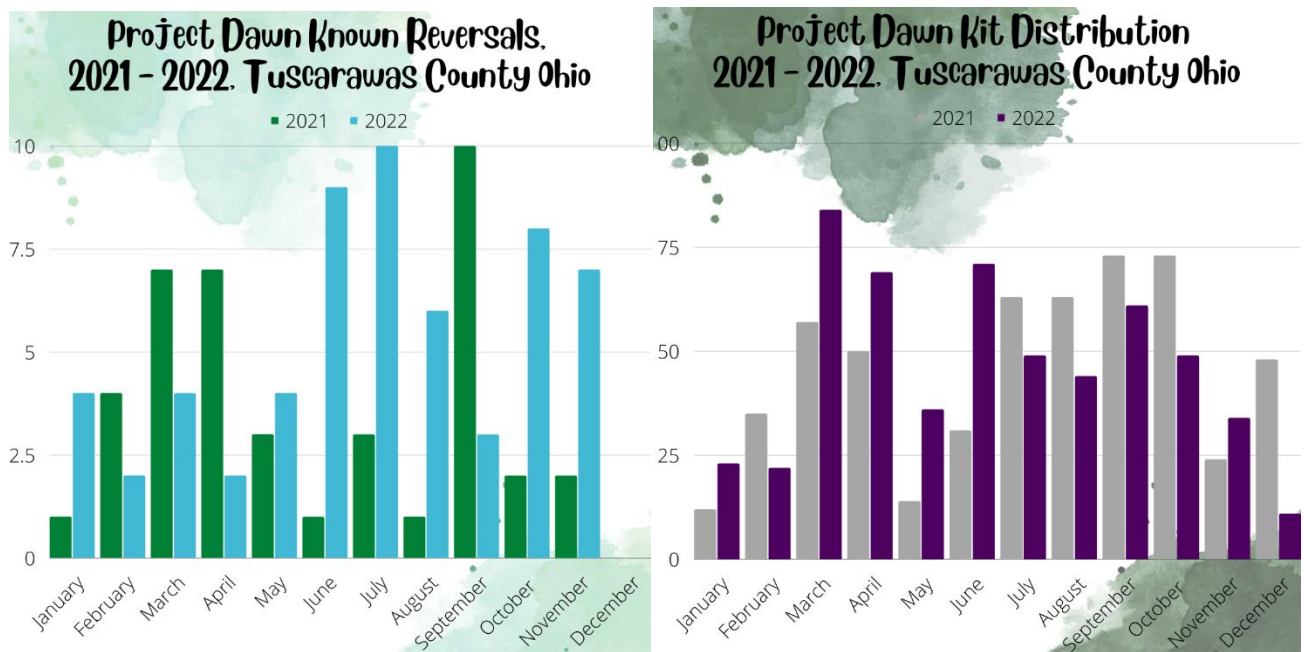

Katelyn completed a radio interview with WJER for their Santa on Wheels community spotlight. She talked about the Cribs for Kids, Ohio Buckles Buckeyes car seat program, and Safe Beginnings programs.

Project Dawn:

During December 2022, TCHD distributed 11 Naloxone kits, trained 10 people, and 3 known reversals. That is a decrease of 67.6% of kits distributed November to December 2022.

There were 54 First Responder Naloxone kits distributed to the following entities: Cleveland Clinic Union Hospital Police, Tuscarawas County Sheriff's Office, and New Philadelphia City Fire Department EMS.



Natasha and Lakyn attended the Tuscarawas County Addiction Taskforce on December 8th held at the ADAMHS Board Office.

The IN23 grant ended on December 31, 2022, this covered October 1, 2021, through December 31, 2022. The goal of the IN23 grant was to distribute 300 kits, TCHD distributed 665 kits. This is an increase of 121.7%. From January 1 through December 31, 2022, TCHD distributed 553 kits, 498 people received training, and 62 overdose reversals were recorded.

Safe Beginnings:

Abbie served eleven (11) families during the month of December. Equipment distributed consisted of three (3) cribs, three (3) toddler beds, five (5) mattresses, one (1) highchair, nine (9) baby monitors, fifteen (15) baby gates, four (4) child proofing kits, four (4) smoke/carbon dioxide alarms, and one (1) fire extinguisher, with a total value of \$2,469.61.

Safe Communities:

An email was sent out to select individuals for a meeting to start the planning process for Teen Roadeo 2023. This meeting will be held in January 2023.

Abbie and Lakyn represented TCHD and Safe Communities at New Towne Mall in New Philadelphia for a Holiday Shopping Event on December 10th. Messages of Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over, Click it or Ticket, and Stay Alive Don't Text & Drive were promoted during the event. Abbie and Lakyn were able to interact with 30 individuals at the store providing informational brochures and materials. There was about 300 people that indirectly saw the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over tablecloth, and the Safe Communities banner.

Abbie completed the WBTC Radio Show on Monday, December 12th and discussed upcoming traffic safety campaigns, events, and updated crash statistics for Tuscarawas County.

Tobacco:

Think Fast Interactive educational assembly was held at Indian Valley High School on December 2nd. The purpose of this assembly is to educate students about the harms and dangers associated with vaping and marijuana.

Katelyn gave an educational presentation on the harms of vaping and nicotine to the freshman class at Dover High School.

Katelyn and Lakyn met with the Tuscarawas County Sheriff's Department to start planning compliance checks at tobacco retailers across Tuscarawas County.

Katelyn and Lakyn are continuing to work with Leadership Tusc and the Newcomerstown High School Teen Leadership Class to complete our Leadership Tusc Project.
