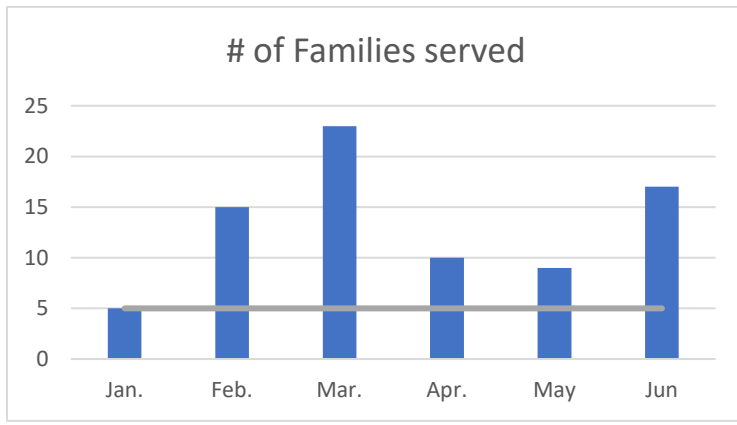


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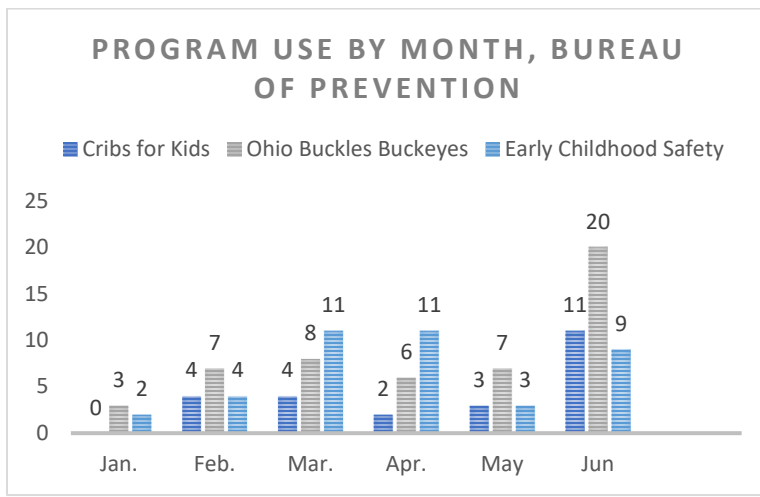

General Health Education

Abbigail Benton started June 27, 2022 and has completed new hire orientation.

Abigale Raber started the 2022 Community Baby Shower planning. A meeting was held on June 29th at TCHD.

Performance Measures:

For 2022, the performance measures that health education will be focusing on are:

- A tobacco-free community.
- An engaged community.

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- A prepared and safe community.

Project Dawn:

During June 2022, TCHD distributed 71 Naloxone kits, trained 60 people, and 9 known reversals. That is an increase of 97% of kits distributed May to June 2022.

Autumn presented at Vertava Health and distributed 5 kits.

Safe Beginnings:

Abigale completed end of year reporting for Safe Beginnings for the grant period ending June 30th. In June, TCHD served nine (9) families infant safety equipment totaling \$2,208.58.

Equipment distributed in June includes a variety of cribs, toddler beds, mattresses, baby monitors, baby gates, safety kits, thermometers, smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, highchairs and strollers.

Safe Communities:

Natasha worked with ODOT District 11 to get traffic safety banners hung up at three locations in the county: Dover Park and Ride, New Philadelphia Park and Ride, and ODOT District 11 in New Philadelphia.

Josh attended the virtual Motorcycle Safety Committee meeting presented by the Ohio State Highway Patrol on June 8th. The meeting discussed upcoming construction zones, and motorcycle crashes and trends throughout District 7.

Autumn and Josh represented TCHD and Safe Communities in Dennison on June 3rd during the annual Railroad Festival. Messages of Click it or Ticket and Look Out For Motorcycles were promoted during the festival. OhioSADD representative and Safe Communities partner, Deanne Hicks, was in attendance. Over three hundred (300) festival attendees were able to see the traffic safety messages. Autumn and Josh were able to interact with eighty individuals at the festival, providing informational brochures and materials.

Autumn and Josh represented TCHD and Safe Communities in New Philadelphia on June 6th at the Bicycle Rodeo. The event included local law enforcement, fire department, and other agencies providing safety to the citizens of Tuscarawas County. During the event, over fifty (50) traffic safety materials were distributed, and over two hundred (200) individuals were able to

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see the traffic safety messages of Click It Or Ticket, Drive Sober Or Get Pulled Over, Don't Text and Drive, and Look Out For Motorcycles.

Autumn and Josh represented TCHD and Safe Communities in Newcomerstown on June 25th at the Cy Young Festival. Over the course of the event, over 200 attendees were able to see the traffic safety messages of Drive Sober Or Get Pulled Over, and Look Out For Motorcycles and fifty (50) individuals were able to receive safety materials such as motorcycle maps, informational brochures and traffic safety magnets.

Safe Communities staff distributed 465 campaign materials to the Tuscarawas County citizens at various events throughout the month of June.

Tobacco:

Autumn Poland completed the remaining grant year deliverables and submitted for approval with a final quarter total reimbursement of \$64,675. Included in the final submissions were Cessation and Youth community wide project reports that indicated exceeding ODH target reach. Additionally, the Tobacco staff in partnership with Jodi Salvo, were able to gain final approval for the 5-year strategic plan with our Health Equity workgroup.

Looking forward to the start of the TU23 grant, Autumn worked with key stakeholders to garner support of a potential Tobacco Retail License.

The Tobacco staff also hosted the monthly Tobacco – Vaping Committee meeting where a wonderful discussion was held on gaining great participation at booths during community events.

Josh attended the monthly 922 coalition meeting where further details regarding the community red-boxes and community garden were discussed.

Traffic Safety:

As of June 30, 2022, there have been five (5) fatal crashes resulting in five (5) fatalities in Tuscarawas County. The image below illustrates all crashes in June 2022 in Tuscarawas County. In June, there were a total of 155 accidents, of which two (2) were fatal.

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
