

Health Education BOH Report: May 2022

Benchmarks:

Of RFPS: 1 new (falls prevention)

Of families served: Nine (9) (Six (6) families received equipment only, one (1) family received equipment and a car seat check, and two (2) additional families received car seat checks only.)

Of community events: Three (3)

Car Seats:

Abigale distributed three (3) convertible car seats and two (2) booster seats.

During the Click It or Ticket event on May 21st, Abigale and OPRC Nicole Dorsey hosted a car seat check event where two families completed car seat education and Abigale received three (3) of five (5) mandatory seat checks for CPST CEU's.

Besides the car seat check event, Abigale completed one (1) additional multi-car car seat check at TCHD.

Cribs for Kids:

Abigale completed safe sleep education with two (2) families and distributed two (2) cribettes to families with no other safe sleep options in the home.

Abigale submitted the monthly report and invoice for April and prepared the monthly report for May.

Accreditation:

The accreditation committee met on May 19th to go over re-accreditation and roles/responsibilities.

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Emergency Preparedness:

Natasha completed several PHEP deliverables for the month: 5.4 (Outbreak Reporting); 4.2 (Community Partners); and 12.1 (AAR/IP Activity Report).

Natasha attended the Tuscarawas County LEPC exercise on May 21st at the Tuscarawas County Fairgrounds.

TCHD received the Notice of Award for PH23 on 5/24/22.

Natasha scheduled meeting with Abigale to review the TCHD ERP in June.

Abigale attended the Planned Partners meeting at the Tuscarawas County EMA on Thursday, May 5th.

Abigale travelled to Franklin County EMA to attend the Medical Countermeasures: Point of Dispensing (POD), Planning and Response from Tuesday, May 17th to Wednesday, May 18th.

Josh attended and completed virtual ICS – 300 training from Tuesday Monday, 3rd to Friday, May 6th and virtual ICS – 400 training from May 23rd to Wednesday, May 25th.

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General Health Education

Natasha submitted the application for the Falls Prevention Pilot Project on Friday, May 27th.

Natasha submitted the Enhanced Operation FY23 (COVID) grant application on Thursday, May 26th.

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Natasha with the assistance of Jennifer conducted four (4) interviews for the open Public Health Educator position during the month of May. Recommendations for the position were sent to Katie.

Abigale attended the Safety Committee meeting on Thursday, May 19th and presented a locked door rule at TCHD which went into effect on Monday, May 23rd dedicating only two doors to remain accessible throughout the business day.

Abigale began working on updated Evacuation Maps and Procedures for posting throughout TCHD with the Safety Committee.

Performance Measures:

For 2022, the performance measures that health education will be focusing on are:

- A tobacco-free community.
- An engaged community.
- A prepared and safe community.

Project Dawn:

During May 2022, TCHD distributed 36 Naloxone kits, trained 36 people, and 4 known reversals. That is a decrease of 47.8% of kits distributed April to May 2022.

Autumn Poland joined Jennifer Demuth at Vertava Health to observe the Project Dawn presentation to clients. Autumn plans to assist and /or facilitate with this presentation in the future.

Safe Beginnings:

Abigale provided verbal and printed safety education to five (5) families and distributed concrete safety equipment consisting of: cribs (3), toddler bed (1), mattresses (4), strollers (2), safety gate (1), thermometer (1) and safety kit (1).

Abigale prepared the monthly report for OCTF, and Natasha submitted on 05/16/2022.

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Safe Communities:

Natasha hosted the quarterly Safe Communities coalition and fatal crash review committee meetings on May 25th. This meeting was held hybrid, allowing for people to attend in person or virtually. The fatal crash review committee reviewed three (3) fatal crashes; one (1) pending from July 2021 and two (2) from January 2022.

Natasha submitted the FY23 Grant Application on Thursday, May 26th.

Josh and Natasha represented TCHD and Safe Communities at Newcomerstown High School on May 19th distributing traffic safety messages the week of prom. Messages of Stay Alive Don't Text and Drive and Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over were promoted during lunch periods. Over 120 students were able to see these messages and interact with Josh and Natasha.

Josh and Natasha represented Safe Communities at the Community Safety Day event on May 21st; this event also served as our annual Click It or Ticket (CIOT) Kickoff. It is estimated that over 5,000 individuals saw the CIOT banner posted on the fence at the event. Over the course of the event TCHD staff were able to interact with 40 individuals providing traffic safety tips and knowledge.

Abigale and Josh represented TCHD and Safe Communities at the Canal Dover Days Festival on Friday, May 27th. Over the course of the event, over 100 community members were able to see traffic safety messages of Look Out For Motorcycles and Stay Alive Don't Text and Drive.

Safe Communities staff distributed 481 campaign materials to the Tuscarawas County citizens at various events including Newcomerstown High School Prom, Safety Day/CIOT Kick Off, and Canal Dover Days Festival.

During the month of May there were eleven (11) Facebook posts promoting the Community Safety Day and CIOT Kick Off with a reach of 19,242. There were zero (0) Instagram posts with a reach of 0. There were three (3) tweets promoting the Safety Day/CIOT Kick off with a reach of 160.

Tobacco:

TCHD received the NOA for TU23 on 5/26/2022.

Autumn attended the Leadership Tusc graduation event where the class presented their summary from the Community Tobacco Cessation project. The group represented 4 different

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community sectors and were able to reach 650 citizens with cessation materials and attained an 9% increase in knowledge of tobacco efforts in the community.

With the backing of Empower Tusc, Autumn worked with Jodi Salvo to arrange for Think Fast Interactive to present Anti Vaping messaging to both Claymont Middle and High Schools.

Autumn and Josh Sample, along with Ohio Guidestone staff, did follow up presentation of Vaping Jeopardy to the 7th grade classes at Claymont Middle School.

Autumn met with Miles Riley from Springvale Health Centers to present a secondhand smoking policy for their Behavioral Health clinic.

With the permission of Natasha and Amy Kiser, Autumn presented vaping data and My Life, My Quit information to the clinic staff in advance of clinic sports physicals.

Traffic Safety:

The image below illustrates all crashes in May 2022 in Tuscarawas County. In May, there were a total of 160 accidents, of which none were fatal. As of May 31st, there have been three (3) fatal crashes in Tuscarawas County.
