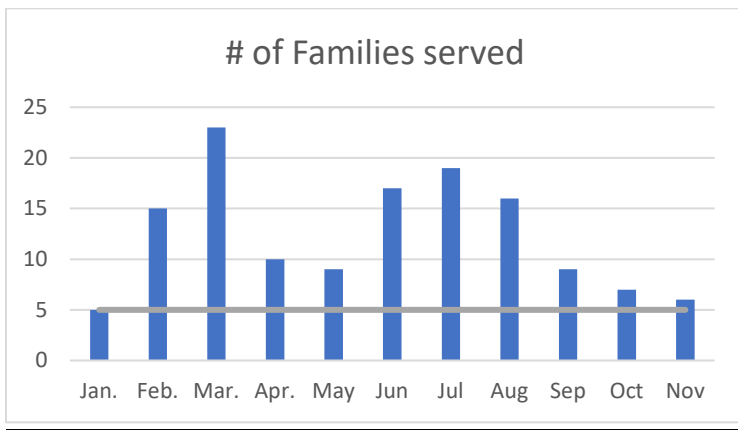

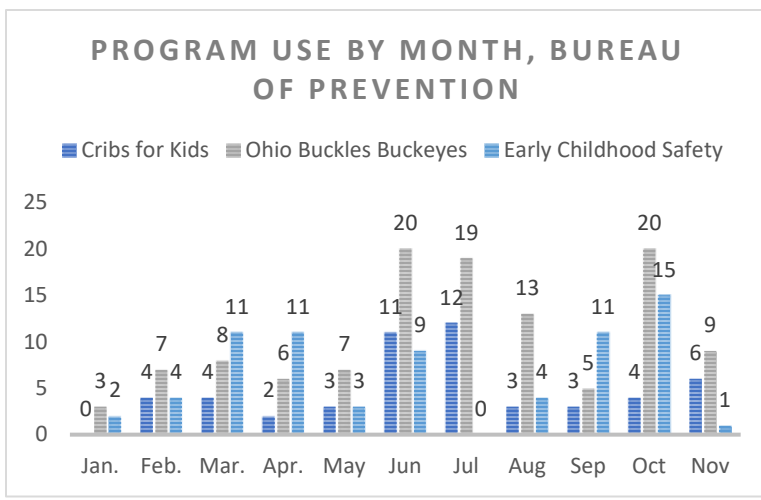

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Car Seats:

Abbie distributed nine (9) convertible car seats and two (2) high-back boosters during the month of November.

Abbie taught a car seat class to Job and Family Services clients on November 15th. There were 11 attendees who received the education.

We received a transfer of 10 convertible car seats from another county in the region.

Cribs for Kids:

Abbie provided safe sleep education and portable cribettes to six (6) families who did not have safe places for baby to sleep in Tuscarawas County.

Emergency Preparedness:

Natasha and Emma have been working on PHEP Deliverables as it relates to the Integrated Preparedness Plan and Medical Counter Measures. The IPP was submitted to ODH on November 28th.

Natasha and Emma continue to sit on weekly ODH Epi calls as able.

Natasha has been working with the NECO region and the Tuscarawas County EMA to plan the annual PHEP exercise. This years will be held in January and will be a tabletop exercise on radiological.

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Abigail, Emma, Katelyn, Lakyn attended the quarterly Ohio Injury Prevention Partnership meeting on November 4th.

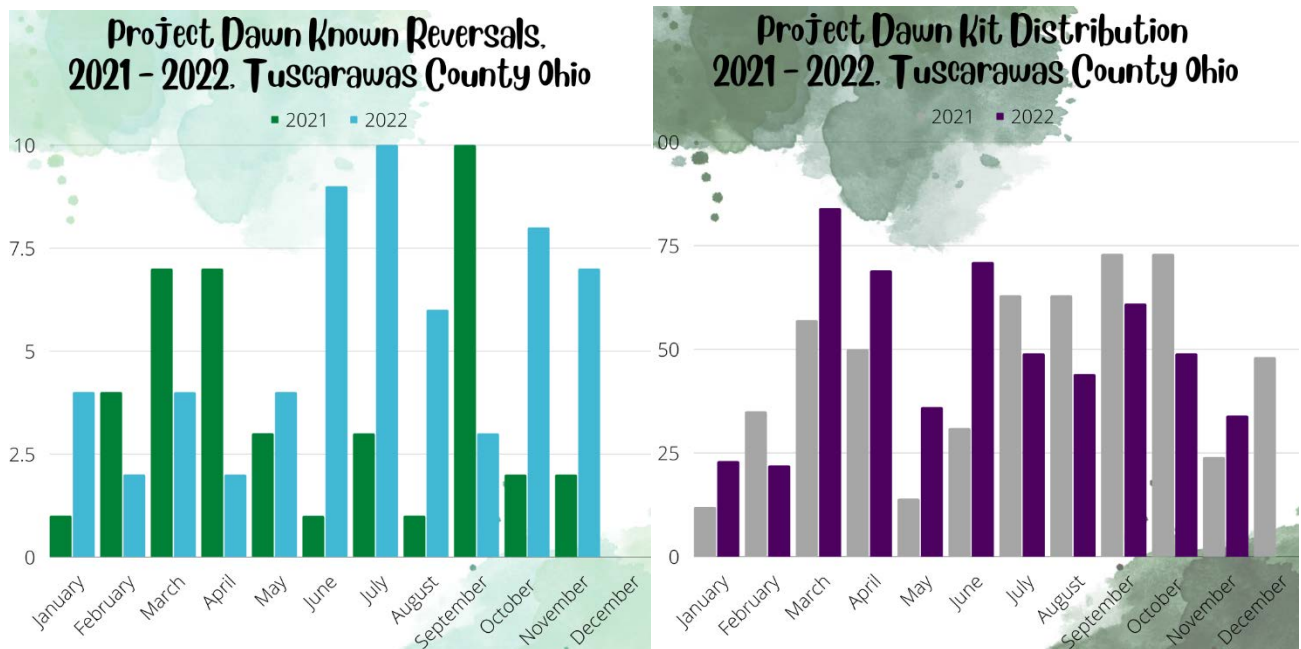
Emma worked on the 2023 ODH Lead Prevention Healthy Homes Awareness grant application.

Lakyn worked on the NACCHO grant application for Strengthening Capacity in Suicide, Overdose, and ACEs Prevention: Community Prevention Framework Pilot. Natasha submitted the application on November 18th, we are to be notified on or around December 1st if awarded.

Project Dawn:

During November 2022, TCHD distributed 34 Naloxone kits, trained 31 people, and 7 known reversals. That is a decrease of 30.6% of kits distributed October to November 2022.

Katelyn presented at Vertava Health and Lakyn attended to learn how to do the Narcan training.



Safe Beginnings:

Abbie served one family during the month of November. Equipment distributed consisted of two cribs and two mattresses, with a total value of \$336.64.

Safe Communities:

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Abbie and Lakyn represented TCHD and Safe Communities at Buehler's in Dover for a Thanksgiving Shopping Event on November 23rd. Messages of Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over, Click it or Ticket, and Stay Alive Don't Text & Drive were promoted during the event. Abbie and Lakyn were able to interact with 10 individuals at the store providing informational brochures and materials. There was about 150 people that indirectly saw the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over tablecloth, and the Safe Communities banner.

Abbie and Natasha hosted the quarterly Safe Communities coalition and fatal crash review committee meetings on November 16th at the Tuscarawas County Sheriff's office. This meeting was held hybrid, allowing for people to attend in person or virtually. The fatal crash review committee reviewed two (2) fatal crashes.

Safe Communities staff distributed 65 campaign materials to the Tuscarawas County citizens at various events including Senior Center Open House, JFS car seat class, and Thanksgiving Shopping Event.

Tobacco:

TCHD has continued to work with Leadership Tusc and the Newcomerstown High School Teen Leadership class on a county-wide project to educate adults and students about the harms and risks associated with vaping. Katelyn and Lakyn attended the Leadership Tusc class on November 8th to work on the project.

Think Fast Interactive educational assembly on the harms and risks associated with vaping and marijuana use was held at Strasburg for all middle and high school students and at Indian Valley Middle School.

ODH required tobacco grant trainings and meetings were attended on November 3rd, 9th, and 15th.

Katelyn presented to the Indian Valley High School health class on November 14th about what electronic cigarettes are, the health harms associated with using these devices, and what resources students can access for more information and cessation counseling.

Katelyn trained the Ohio Guidestone Prevention Services staff on the Ask, Counsel, Treat (ACT) model for talking to youth about their nicotine product use on November 18th.

My Life My Quit cessation resources were distributed at the New Towne Mall Reading Festival and to Tusky Valley High School.

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Traffic Safety:

The image below illustrates all crashes in November 2022 in Tuscarawas County. In November, there were a total of 254 accidents, two of which was fatal.
