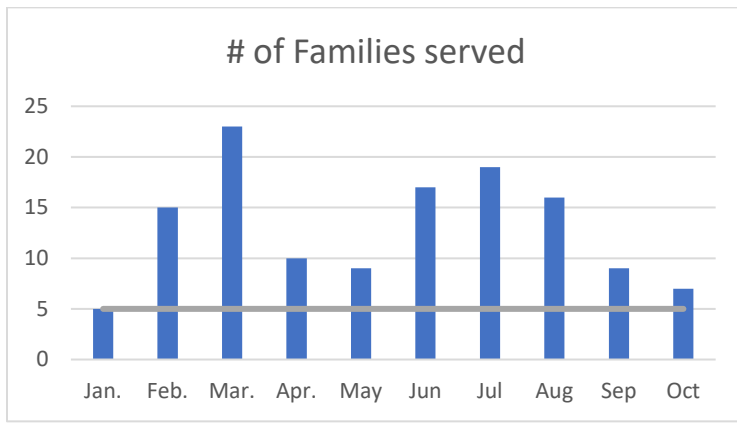

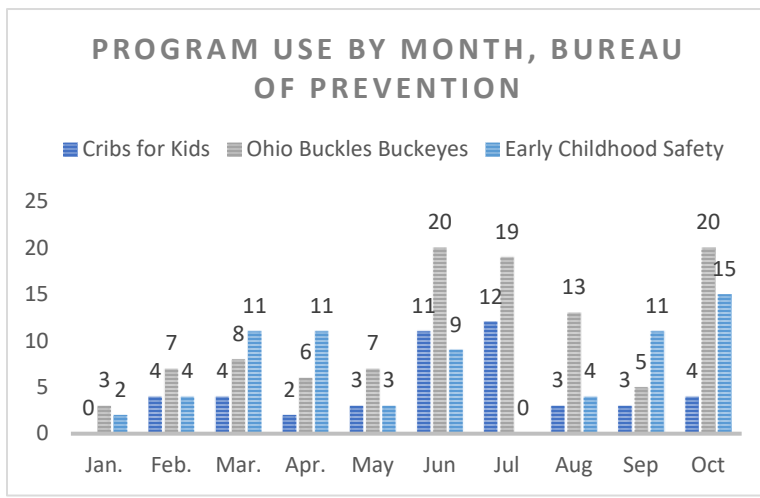

Lakyn Craig joined the Health Ed team on October 24th.

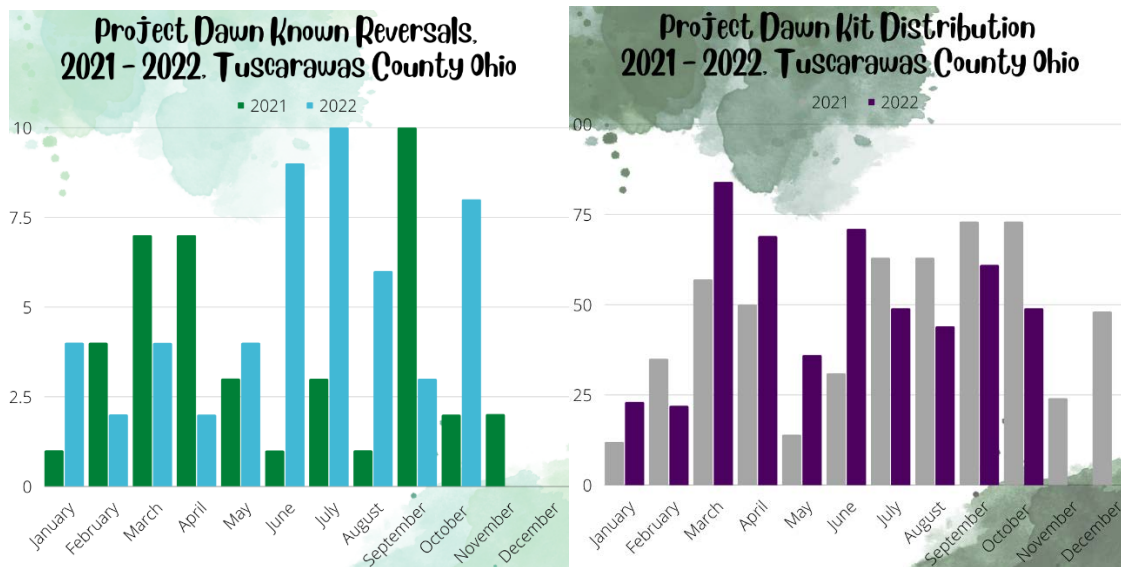

Project Dawn:

During October 2022, TCHD distributed 49 Naloxone kits, trained 41 people, and 8 known reversals. That is a decrease of 19.6% of kits distributed September to October 2022.

No presentations were conducted at Vertava Health due to Columbus Day Holiday and TCHD being closed.



Safe Beginnings:

Abigale and Abbie served fifteen families during the month of October. Equipment distributed consisted of cribs, toddler beds, mattresses, highchairs, strollers, baby monitors, baby gates, smoke/co2 alarms, fire extinguishers, thermometers, and bath thermometers, with a total value of \$3,768.32.

Safe Communities:

Emma and Brittany represented TCHD and Safe Communities at the Twin City Fall Festival in Uhrichsville on October 8th. Messages of Click it or Ticket, Look Out for Motorcycles, Stay Alive Don't Text & Drive, and Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over were promoted during the festival. Emma and Brittany were able to interact with over 50 individuals at the fair providing informational brochures and materials. There was about 150 people that indirectly saw the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over tablecloth, Safe Communities tent, and banner.

Safe Communities staff distributed 345 campaign materials to the Tuscarawas County citizens at various events throughout the month of September.

Tobacco:

TCHD has applied and been selected to as one of the projects for the Leadership Tusc class this year. We will be partnering with Newcomerstown High School Teen Leadership class to complete this project.

The Tobacco staff hosted the monthly Tobacco – Vaping Committee meeting where committee members reviewed the Community Survey on Tobacco results and discussed the Leadership Tusc project with the Newcomerstown High School Teen Leadership class.

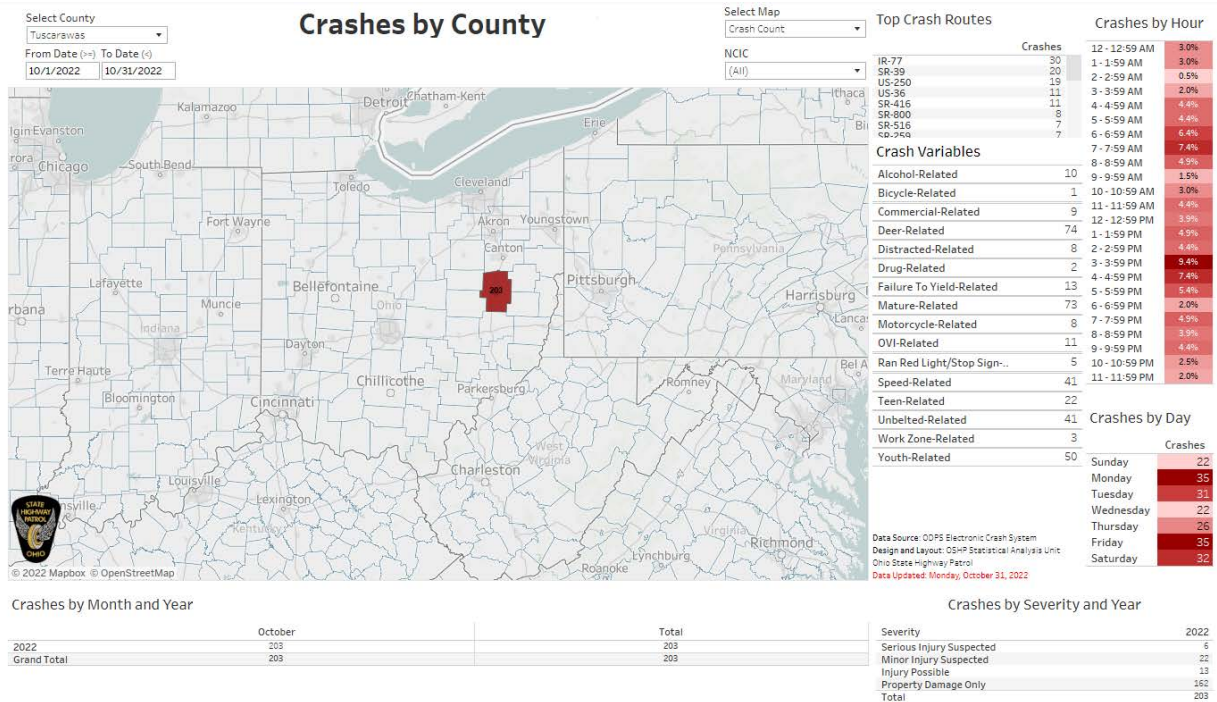

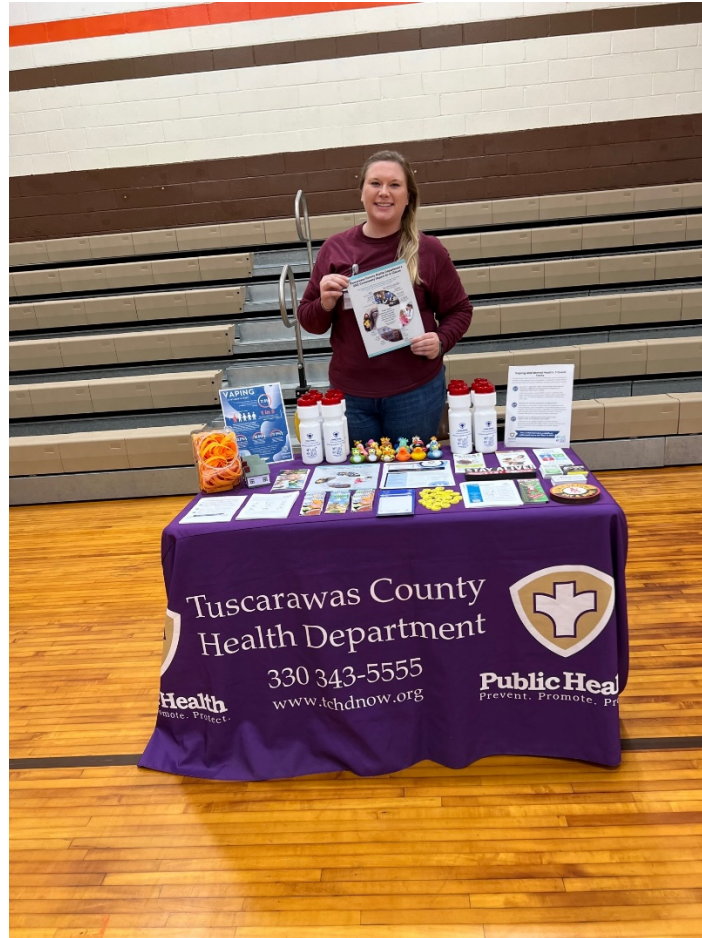
