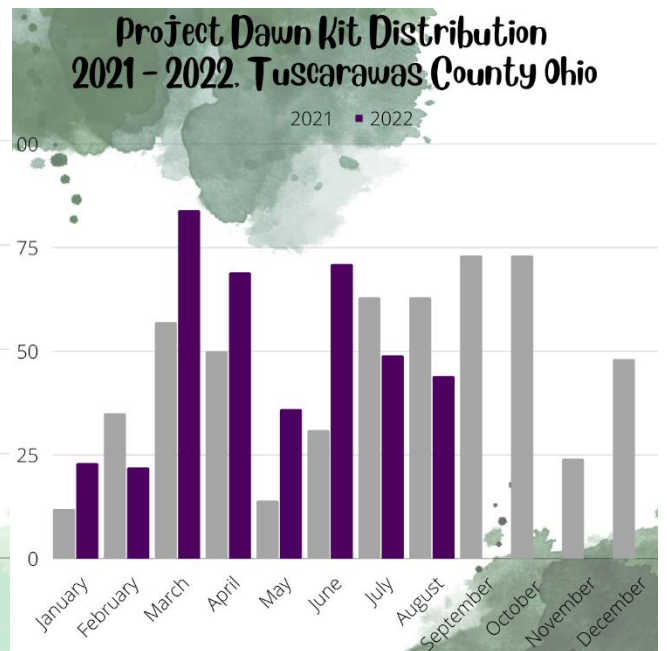
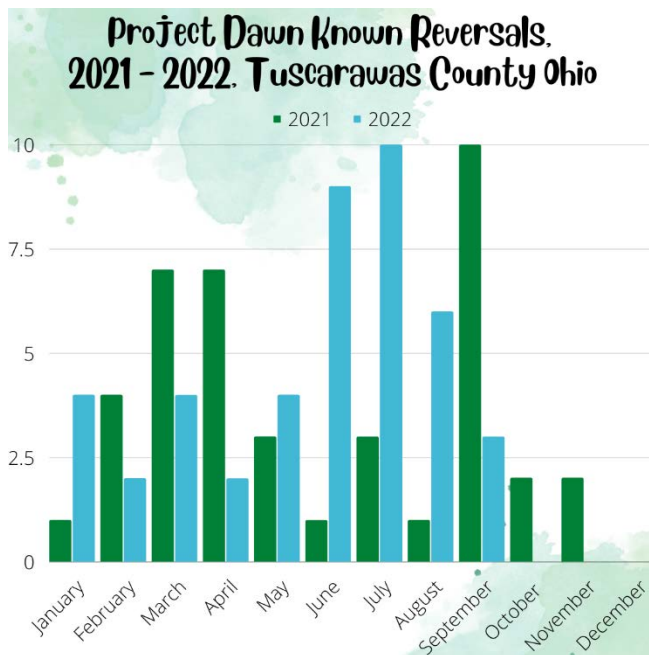
The Health Ed team visited NewPointe Community Church in Dover on Thursday, September 29th to set up for the upcoming Community Baby Shower event.

Abbie created an event guideline as part of her Continuous Quality Improvement project and has distributed this to staff. An event box has been created with materials that are needed at events.

Project Dawn:

During September 2022, TCHD distributed 61 Naloxone kits, trained 61 people, and 3 known reversals. That is an increase of 38.6% of kits distributed August to September 2022.

Katelyn presented at Vertava Health and Emma went to learn how to do the trainings as a back up.



Safe Beginnings:

Abigale and Abbie served ten families during the month of September. Equipment distributed consisted of cribs, mattresses, highchairs, strollers, baby monitors, baby gates, smoke alarms and other safety equipment, with a total value of \$3117.53.

Safe Communities:

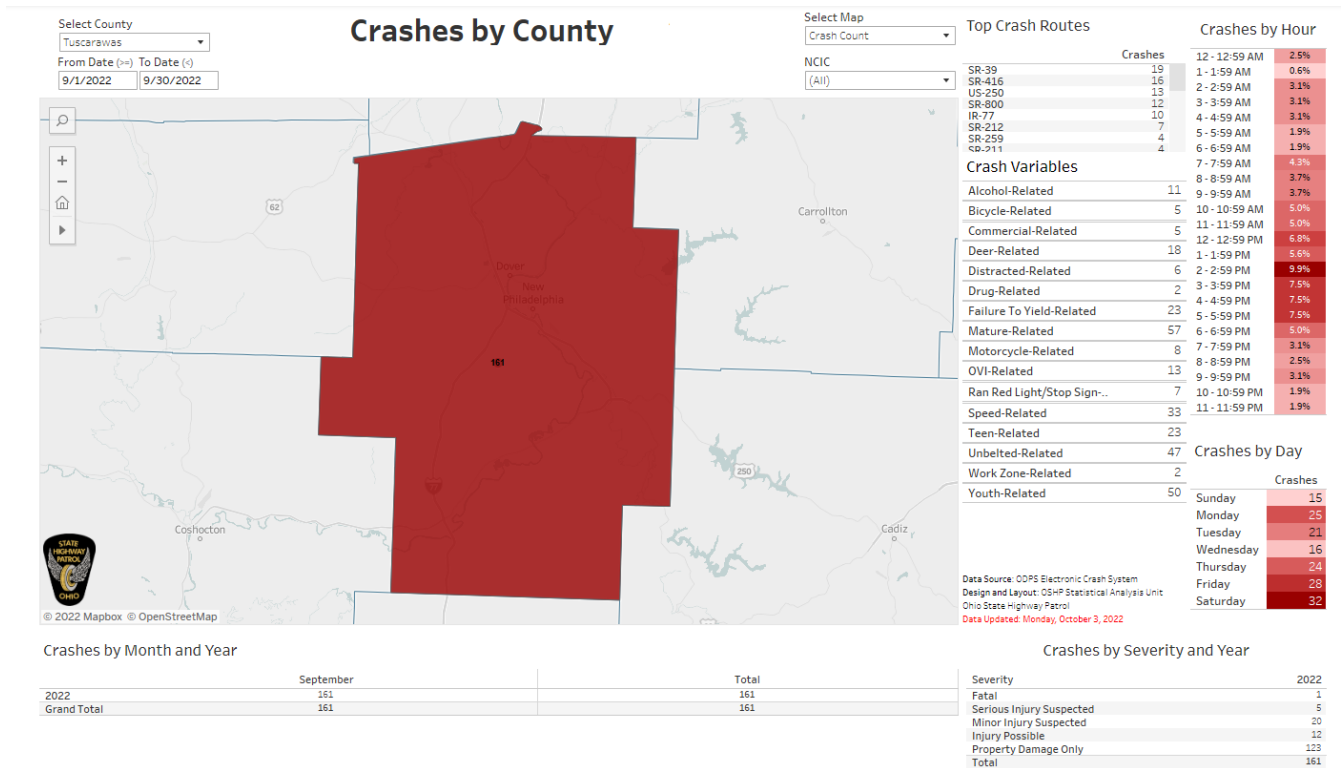

Katelyn completed an Ask, Advise, and Refer (AAR) training with Bridges to Wellness. Katelyn talked with the Strasburg Youth2 Youth group about having them participate in the Advocacy Through Art Project for the Tobacco grant.

Tobacco cessation resources, STAND stretchy bands, My Life My Quit promotional resources, and educational vaping information were distributed at the Tuscarawas County Fair, the Claymont Homecoming Football Game, Strasburg Youth 2 Youth meeting, and Swiss Festival.
