Medical Office

- Charges in June \$40,027 (12-month average \$61,225)
- Payments in June \$21,030 (12-month average \$34,841)
- Largest payer Commercial Insurance (25%)
- 20% no-show rate (+1%)
- 9 new patients in June (71 YTD)
- Current Outstanding Balance \$53,578.92; greater than 90 days \$15,599.65

Promotion and Community Relations

Here are the trending topics and other highlights for June 2025:

- Trending Topics: construction project; farmer's market health fair; air quality precautions; mosquito control; heat wave and early closures; pet emergency preparedness bag event.
- Paid Promotional Campaigns: Project DAWN, suicide prevention, and back-to-school immunizations
- Social Media Posts: 306 social media posts ran in June 2025 (211 on Facebook where our largest audience interacts, 69 on X/Twitter, and 26 on Instagram)
- Top Social Media Posts: The top posts with their respective reach were 1. New Medical Director Dr. Cameron with 38,900 people reached; 2. Missing mosquito trap with 35,500 people reached; 3. Beware of scam callers regarding TCHD/Medicare with 23,900 people reached; 4. Pet Bag event with 14,700 people reached; and 5. Air quality concern with 10,200 people reached.
- TCHD Overall Staff Community Events & Presentations Total (1/1/25-6/30/25): 33 events and 27 presentations
- Larger Project Completions: 138 pet emergency preparedness bags were distributed during the third annual event (a record-breaking year over just less than 80 in 2024). Construction notice and progress update video released.

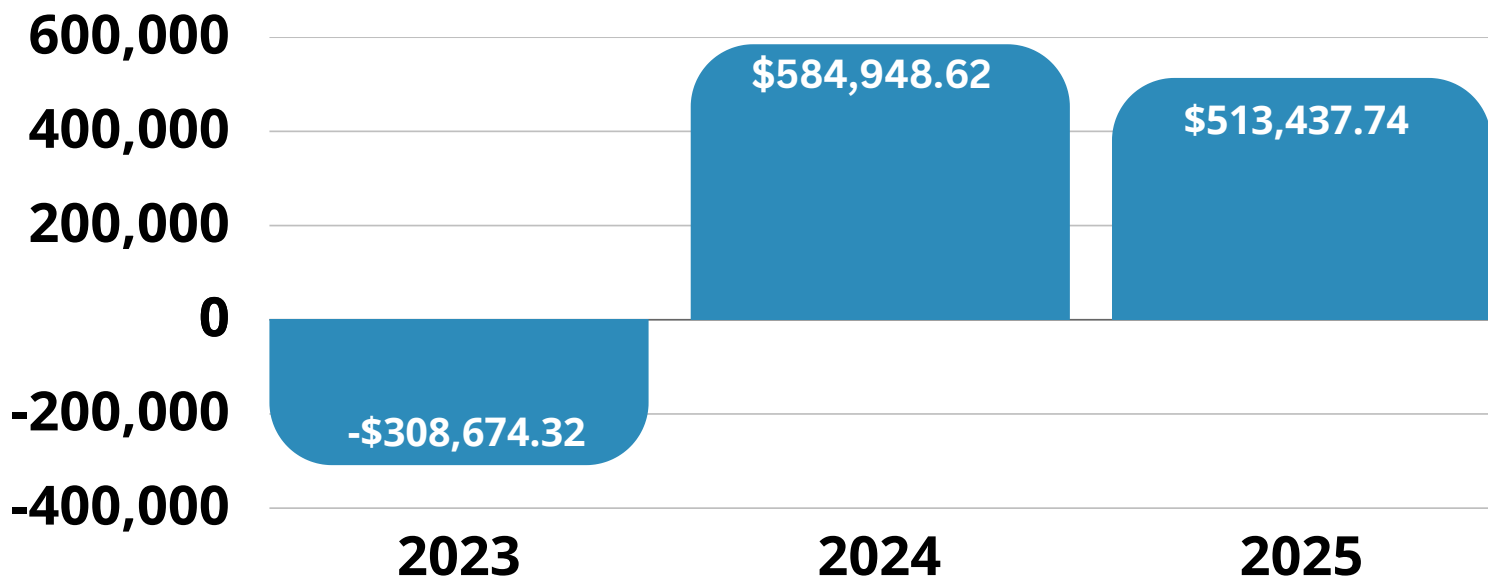
