Released from quarantine, but monitor symptoms & take precautions

7 day w/
testing

Quarantine at Home

Released from quarantine after receiving negative test result, but monitor symptoms & take precautions

If symptoms develop, isolate & get tested

Day 0

earliest date to test

Important: Close contacts of a positive COVID-19 case do not need to quarantine *if* they have tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 3 months OR if they meet all of the following criteria: Are fully vaccinated (at least two weeks have passed since second dose of Moderna or Pfizer, or two weeks since one dose of Johnson & Johnson) and have experienced no symptoms since last exposure to positive case. Please remember that close contacts are defined as persons who have been within 6 feet or less of a positive case for 15 minutes or more during the 48 hours prior to the start of symptoms in the positive case or while the positive case was symptomatic. The CDC recommends that fully vaccinated persons get tested 3-5 days after their exposure, even if they don't have symptoms, and wear a mask indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until their test result is negative.
