### Common Side Effects

- Pain and/or swelling at site of injection
- Fever
- Chills
- Muscle Aches
- Tiredness
- Headache

### Helpful Hints:

If you have pain or discomfort, talk to your doctor about taking an over-the-counter pain medicine, such as ibuprofen or acetaminophen.

- Apply a clean, cool, wet washcloth over the area
- Use or exercise your arm
- Drink plenty of fluids

### Remember:

- It takes time for your body to build protection after any vaccine. You will not be fully protected until 2 weeks after your second dose.
- You should continue to wear your facial covering, wash your hands often and practice social distancing.
- You should get the second shot even if you have side effects after the first one unless your doctor tells you not to get the second shot.

### Important Reminder

Your second dose is due 28 days or after your first dose.
